Common Implementation Plan for the Pact on Migration and Asylum

The Common Implementation Plan for the Pact on Migration and Asylum, adopted by the European Commission on June 12, reflects a comprehensive approach to migration management. This notably includes work on the external dimension of migration, through the pursuit of comprehensive partnerships with partner countries. While actions in this area are not tied to legal obligations, it will be essential for the EU to continue and further intensify work with partner countries, notably in three key areas: the fight against migrant smuggling, effective returns, readmission and reintegration as well as legal pathways. **<u>READ MORE</u>**

EU Talent Pool

On the 13 June 2024, the Council of the EU agreed its position on the EU Talent Pool. The Talent Pool will be set up as an EU-wide online platform that will match profiles of jobseekers from outside the EU with job vacancies for shortage occupations of EU employers. Its aim is to facilitate the recruitment of talent from third countries who live outside the EU, to make the EU labour market more competitive and to tackle shortages on the European labour market. **<u>READ MORE.</u>**
